PLAYHQ | is the designated platform for registering your child/ren, as well as the primary tool utilised by the Wyndham Basketball Association (WBA) to release game schedules. These schedules include crucial details such as the date, time, and venue for each game. Stay informed and up-to-date by accessing the PlayHQ website directly or by utilising the MyHoops app, available for download on GooglePlay or Apple App Store.



Uniform

The HHBC team uniform features a reversible jersey that is white on one side and blue on the other. The team shorts are blue, accented with red and white stripes. For all competition games, players must wear the white side of the jersey. The only instance the blue jersey is worn is when the opponent is another HHBC team, in which case the home team dons the blue jersey.

While players may choose to wear compression garments under their uniform, these must be genuine compression wear rather than standard T-shirts and leggings.



Training

HEATHDALE CHRISTIAN COLLEGE GYMNASIUM (HHBC HQ) | Training sessions are held weekly for one hour at the Heathdale Christian College gym. It is essential to park only in the designated parking areas and avoid parking in front of the closed gates R. Even if the gates are open, driving onto the school grounds is not permitted. Our access to the gymnasium is via the walkway shown by the red arrows in the image below. Please refrain from using other parking areas within the school. Our use of the gym is a privilege, and it is crucial to uphold safety and respect, ensuring that the gym is left in a clean and tidy state after use. Food must be consumed in the foyer before entering the courts. Additionally, non-training children must be supervised at all times while on school grounds. Please limit your access strictly to the gym and walkway areas.



TRAINING AT HHBC HQ | Training sessions are facilitated by dedicated volunteer coaches, whose availability determines the session times. Our coaches undergo continual development opportunities through our club and the WBA. Most of our coaches are parents within the club, generously sacrificing their time to nurture your child's basketball skills. We kindly ask for your support and respect towards them. In case a training session needs to be cancelled for a week, you'll receive updates through your team communication channels. There is no strict uniform requirement for training; players can wear comfortable exercise attire and sneakers. It's recommended for players to carry a water bottle and their own basketball.

Different age groups use specific ball sizes:

- Size 5 for U8-U12 Boys and Girls.
- Size 6 for U14 and older Girls, U14 Boys.
- Size 7 for U16 Boys and older.

Scoring

Scoring for your child's games involves active participation from all families, with each family expected to contribute to scoring duties based on a rotation devised by the Team Manager. The scoring process comprises of two key components: utilising PlayHQ and updating the Electronic Stadium Scoreboard. It is essential for each team's scorer to understand and engage in both aspects of scoring. When fulfilling your scoring responsibilities, remember that you are considered an official for the game. Therefore, it is crucial to maintain communication with the opposing team's scorer to ensure consistency in recorded information. In case of any difficulties during the game, referees are available for assistance.

TALENT WINS GAMES, BUT IT TAKES TEAMWORK TO SCORE!!

Basketball can be a fast-paced game and we all miss things happening right in front of us, it's for this reason we ask for each team to supply a scorer so as a team of two, you can work together to make the process of scoring smooth, effective and pain free.

A scorer is considered an official of the game and should be treated with respect.

Important things as a Scorer to Remember

- Ensure names and numbers are correct at the start of the game.
- At the end of the game, ensure that scores are agreed upon by both Scorers & finalised by Refs.
- Any discrepancies/disputes need to be brought to the attention of the Refs and/or Competition Supervisors
- Do not tick any player in unless they are present courtside. (See Penalties below)
- · Players CAN take the court after halftime if they are already named correctly on the Electronic Scoring or Scoresheet

Seniors

Fill ins can be added courtside if using their correct name and not registered to another team in the same competition. Penalties will apply if they play under another name. (See Penalties below)

Juniors

Fill ins can NOT be added courtside.

If a fill in is required, it must be pre-arranged with your club and entered by them through Play HQ.

If this process hasn't been followed/system hasn't updated in time to reflect the change, permission must be sought from Competition Supervisors.

Penalties for playing ineligible players:


- 1. If a team is found to be playing a player under the wrong name/identity the player, the team will face a loss of up to Six (6) ladder points and all players marked in for that game, will be marked down as ineligible for that round.
- Players must be subbed out once identified that the number is incorrect and only return to the court once the Electronic Scoring has been updated. The clock will not stop for this purpose and the team could have late points applied at the discretion of the Competition Supervisor.
- 3. If a team is found to have ticked in a player(s) as playing and they are not present, the team will face a loss of up to Six (6) ladder points and all players marked in for that game, will be marked down as ineligible for that round.
- 4. Additionally, if a scorer is found to have intentionally added a player, whose name is greyed out as a fill in or points, scores, fouls against a player's name and they are not present, they will be reported to the WBA tribunal for cheating and will face possible suspension.

Abuse of Score officials will not be tolerated and is a reportable offence, if you have concerns about anything related to scoring, please get the assistance of a WBA Competition Supervisor immediately.

- WBA By Laws

Entry in to Eagle Stadium and satellite venues

A \$2 entry fee is required for all domestic games on Fridays & Saturdays for individuals aged 5 and above (children 4 and under enter free of charge) at Eagle Stadium and other outer venues. Free entry is only granted to those with a "pass out" receipt or eligible committee members. Any mistreatment of WBA and Western Leisure Services (WLS) staff will not be accepted, and can result in being reported to the Tribunal.



Code of Conduct

The WBA and HHBC adhere to the **Basketball**Victoria Code of Conduct – respect is paramount in all interactions for everyone involved: players, coaches, spectators, referees, administrators; everyone. All communications need to go through your coach, team manager or committee member. Parents/spectators are not allowed to speak directly with the game officials including the referees, red coat supervisors or scoring bench.

You also should not be disrespectful to the players or parents/spectators on the other team. Remember this is children's sport and what is most important is that everyone is offered the opportunity to have fun and participate in a safe environment. Be the supporter who creates a positive environment for all players, spectators and officials and one your child would be proud of.
